Plan Formulation Process

1. Issuance of Memorandum Circular and Planning Guidelines

2. Drafting of the Plan
 - First draft prepared by the NEDA Secretariat, with inputs from concerned agencies
 - Review by the Planning Committees (PCs)
 - Revision based on comments from the PCs
 - Review by a multi-sectoral group with respect to cross-cutting policy/program issues

Plan Formulation Process

3. Agency central offices (ACOs) shall identify central office/agency programs and projects in consultation with their respective regional line agencies (RLAs)
4. Agencies shall also identify PAPs consistent with fiscal resources
5. MTPIP Matrix shall be submitted to the NEDA Secretariat for evaluation and screening

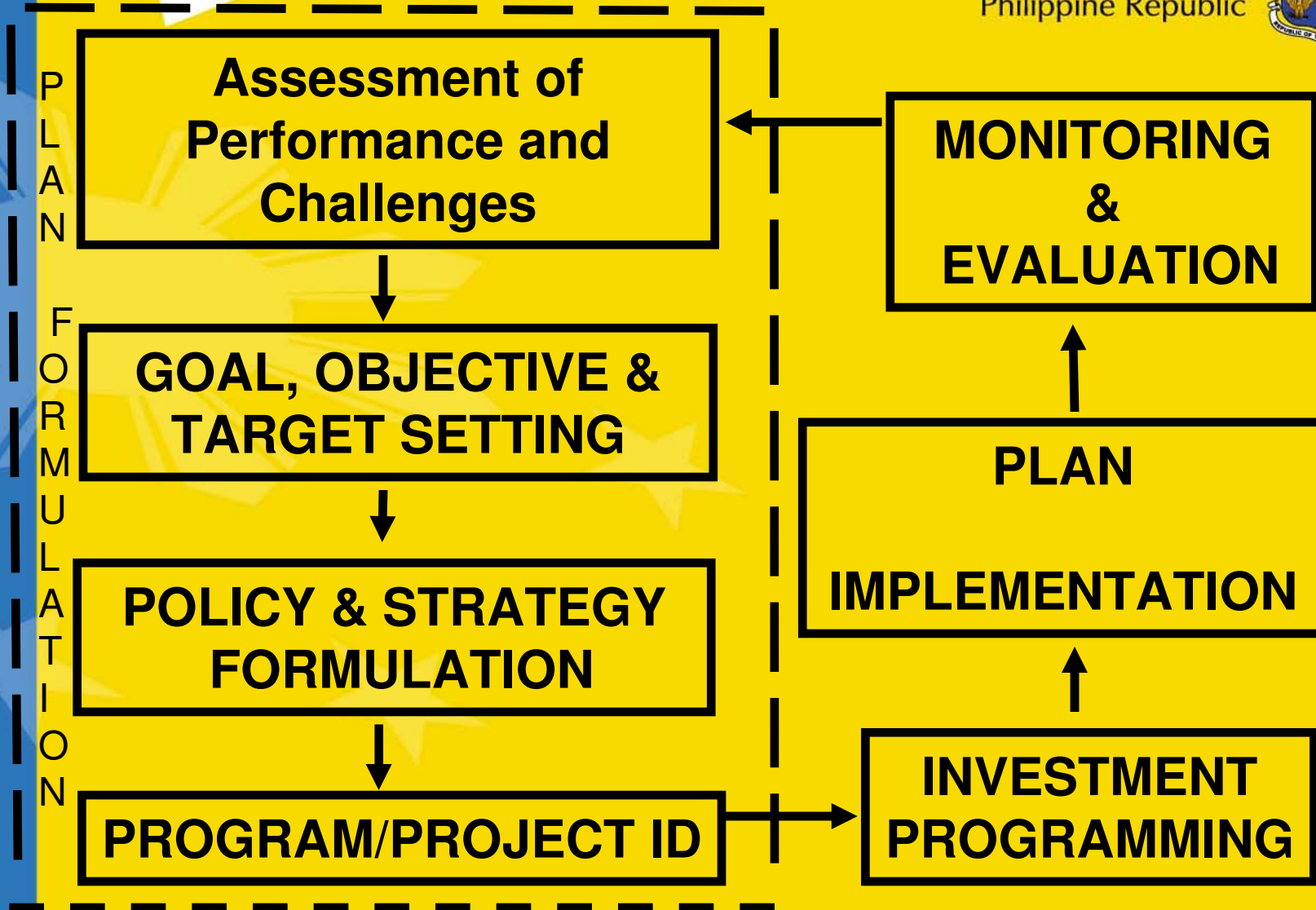


Plan Formulation Process

6. Draft MTPIP to the inter-agency committee for discussion and approval.
7. The MTPDP and MTPIP are presented to the Cabinet Cluster for approval prior to the latter's endorsement of the same for the President's approval.

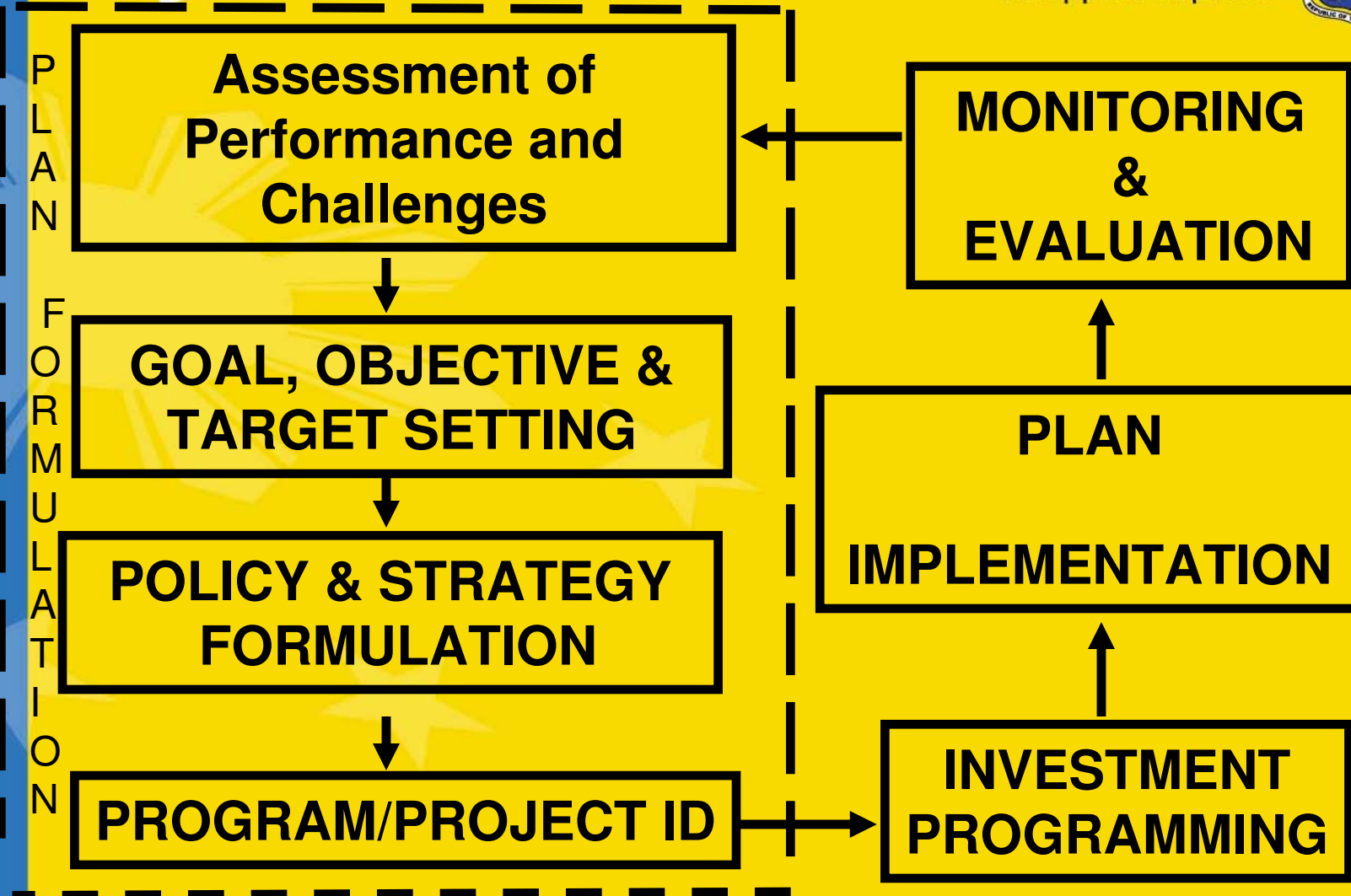

Organizational Set-up

- **NEDA Board**
 - Overall direction and approval of Plan
 - Cabinet clusters as clearing bodies

- **Planning Committees**
 - Existing inter-agency committees as Technical Working Groups

- **Secretariat Support**
 - NEDA Secretariat

Structure of the Planning Committees

- Chair
 - Department Secretary of Lead Agency
- Co-chairs
 - Senate Committee Chair corresponding to lead sector
 - House Committee Chair corresponding to lead sector
 - Secretaries of other key departments
 - Private sector representative as elected by private sector members
- Members
 - members from government, legislature, business, NGOs, Pos, academe, labor groups

Regional Development Plans (RDPs)/Investment Programs

- NEDA-Regional Development Office issues supplemental guidelines consistent with MTPDP

Focus of RDPs/Investment Programs

- Contribution in attaining 10-point agenda
- Growth targets/ specific development interventions
- Guide national government in determining locational priorities for programs and projects
