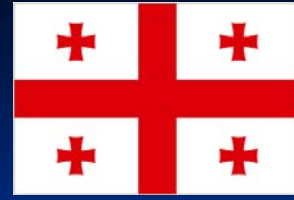

Our objective is

to take this opportunity to communicate regional member countries' views on ADB's role in the following areas:

Bank's Relations with DMCs

- Be more client oriented and responsive in determining the areas of focus and rendering services to DMCs
- Contribute to inter-donor coordination and harmonization of assistance
- Maintain regular and constructive discussions with DMCs on effectiveness of ADB's products and procedures

Project Preparation and Implementation

- Design public sector projects as simple as possible. Avoid convoluted schemes to ensure high success rate and efficiency.
- Take into account the results and lessons of previous projects in the course of designing the new ones in similar sector.
- Provide technical assistance in building and strengthening the Borrower's capacity to prepare and process quality projects according to country's needs and donor's standards

Project Preparation and Implementation (cont'd)

- Allow flexibility in project design to cater for possible adjustments during implementation
- Project design should provide a robust mechanism for tracking the project progress
- Allow reasonable time for the borrower to review the project documentation prior to loan negotiation

Project Preparation and Implementation (cont'd)

- Delegate greater project management functions and authority to RMs
- Enhance ADB's loan accounting and billing system to facilitate the borrowers' debt monitoring and management.

Private Sector Development in our Countries

- Use ADB's unique mandate to the fullest extent possible to attract large private inflows into the region
- ADB's role as the guarantor for the risk-averse private investors is magnified by the recent political developments in the region (e.g. Pakistan and Georgia)

Private Sector Development in our Countries (cont'd)

- Engage in dialogue with private sector to promote our countries vis-à-vis international investors
- Ensure that large capital surpluses in the Asia and Pacific stay in the region and are injected into our economies
- Be innovative and responsive to the dynamic private sector
