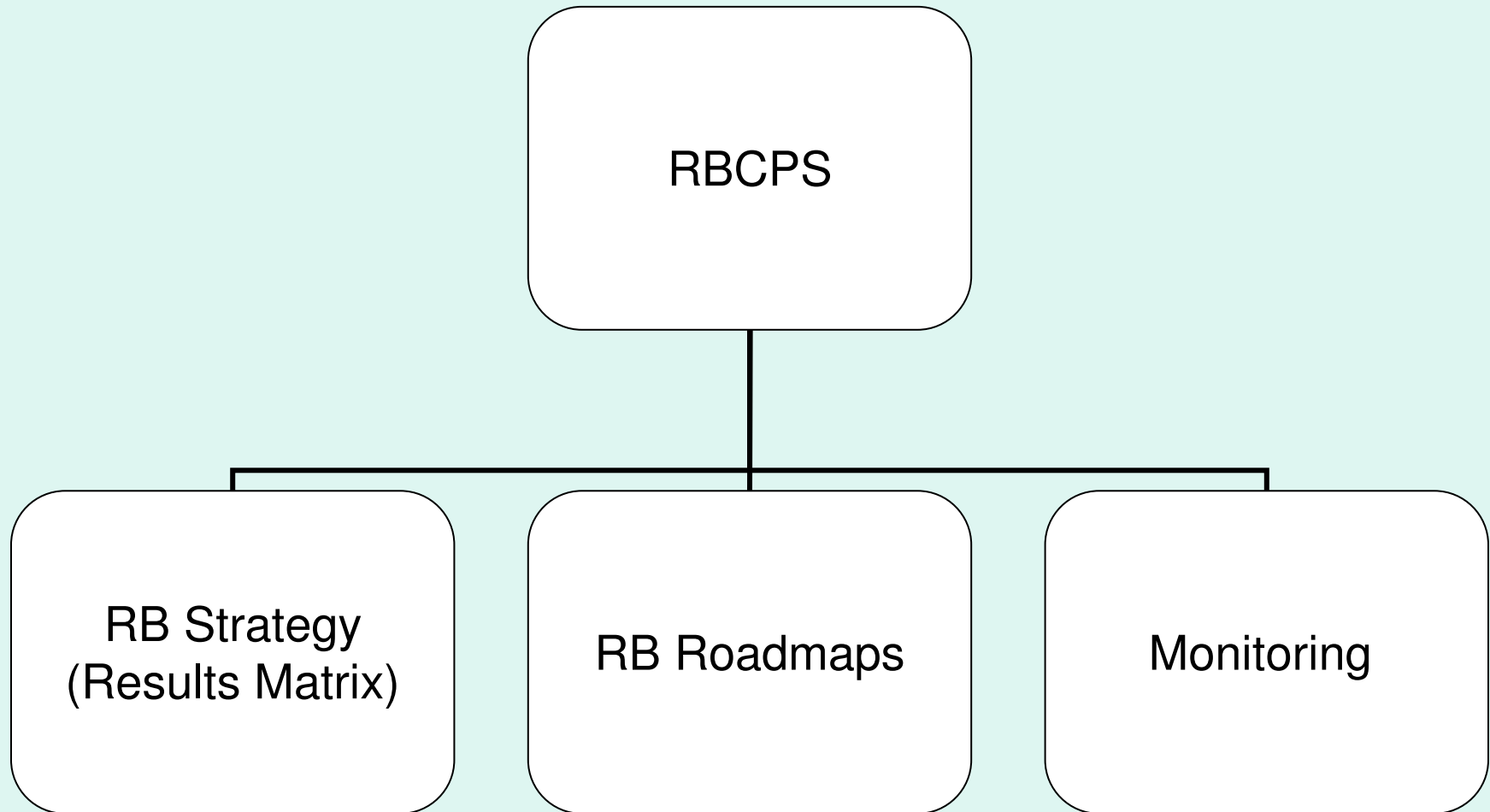

RB Strategy

- Start from the two known edges of the Results Matrix
 - ADB's and other donors' current activities
 - Which shows what you can expect in terms of outcomes in the next 5 years
 - And the other corner, the goals of the National Development Plan that we are supporting

RB Strategy

- An RB Strategy is to connect these two edges together
- What is referred to as the “Missing Middle”
- You decide what various paths get you from the right edge to the left
- And arrive at your sector focus.

Missing Middle

Priority outcomes that ADB is trying to influence--Examples:

- Increase in access to quality health-care,
- Greater targeting of expenditure to poor areas,
- Lower cost to start-up business,
- Improvements in primary school scores,
- Increase access to markets by road,
- Increase access to electrification.

ADB's Approach

- How do we address the objectives in the “Missing Middle”?
 - We select sectors that best address these needs,
 - And develop a sector strategy (roadmap).

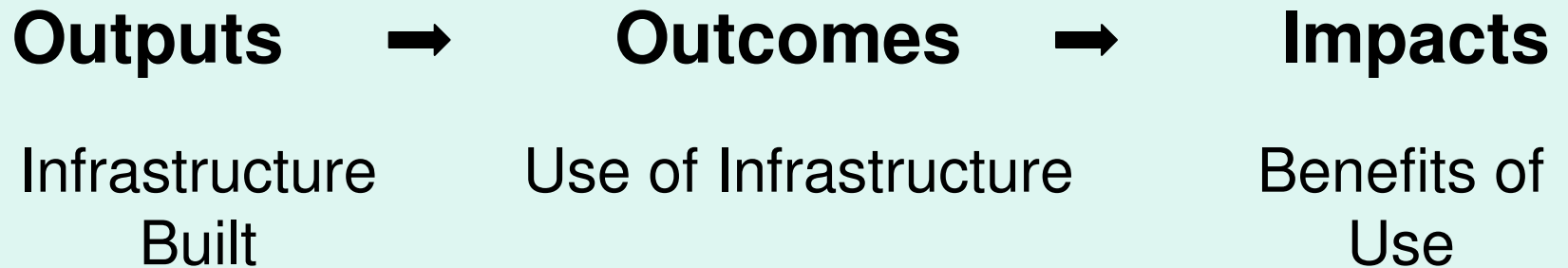
What is a sector roadmap

- It presents a selection of the strategically most significant sector **outcomes**, and the preferred sector **interventions** and **outputs** whose purpose it is to **assist** in the achievement of sector outcomes.

Sectoral Roadmaps

- Very much the same pattern as RBCSP:
 - Identify where we are now
 - Identify what to expect in the next few years
 - Identify what our goals are in the long-term
 - Get us from here to there
