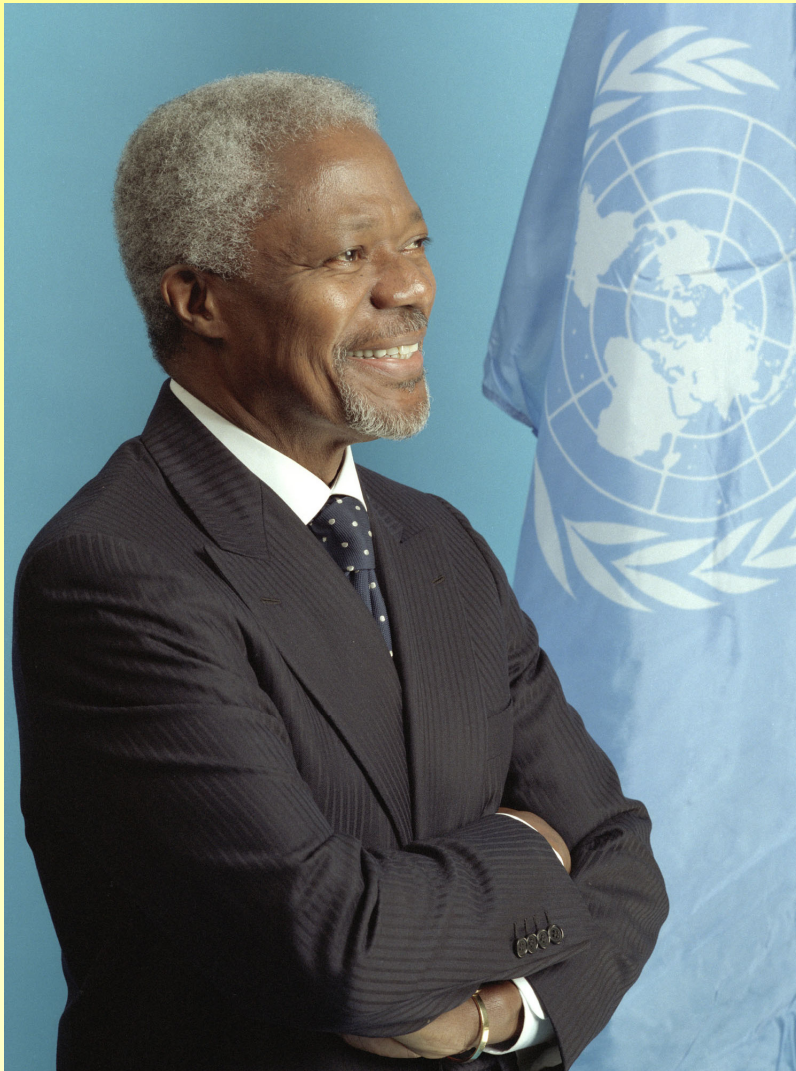

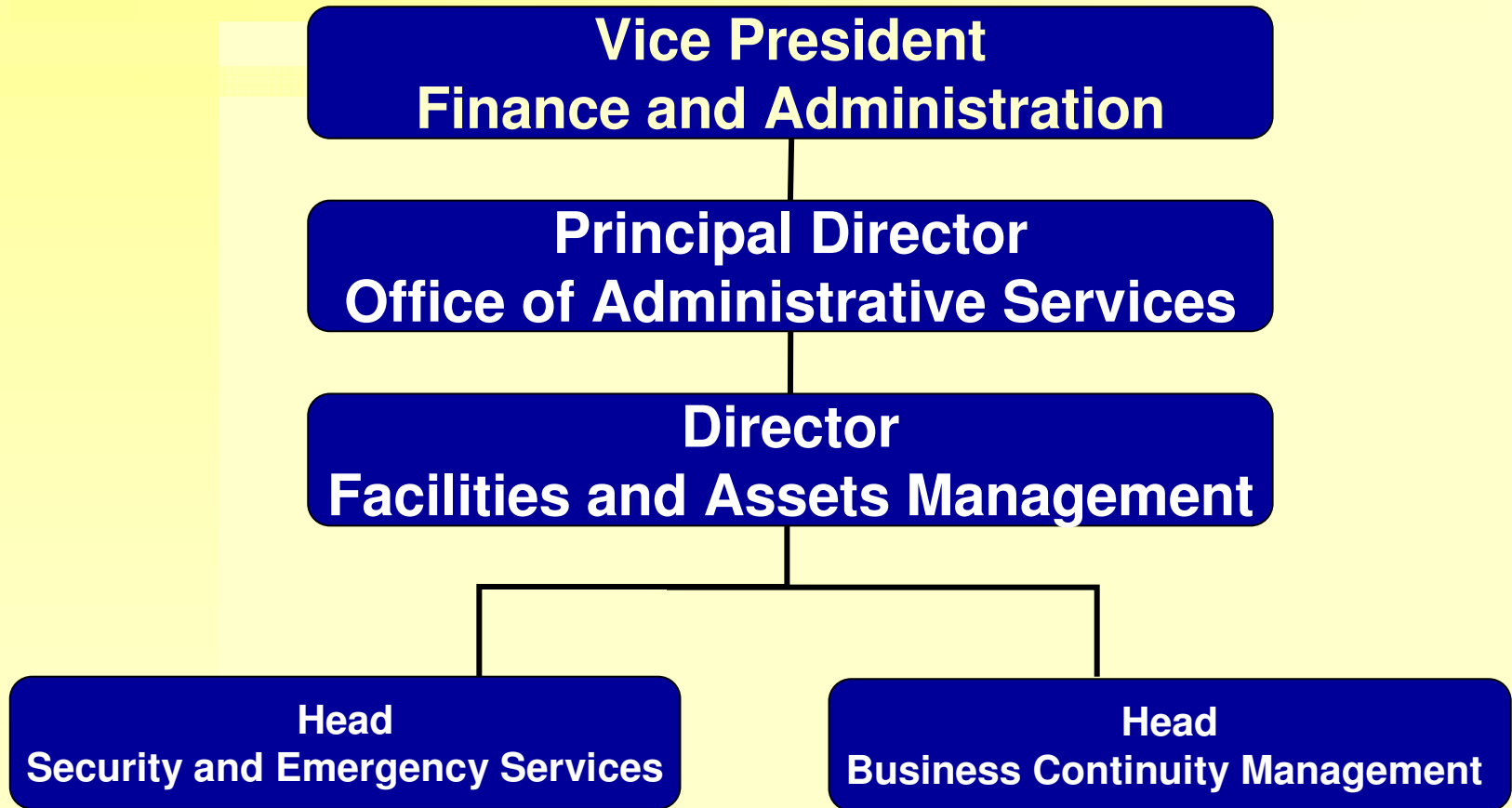

Our Mission

- Providing a safe and secure work environment
- Protecting people by providing practical safety and security services within available resources
- Enabling the safest and most secure delivery of ADB's operational mandate
- Providing best possible emergency preparedness and response support

Our Challenge

- Challenging world security environment; increasingly difficult field environment
- Shift in the nature of threats/international organizations as targets
- Maintaining high security and safety standards
- Enabling delivery of ADB's operational mandate

Our Responsibilities

- Host government has ultimate responsibility
- At Headquarters, ADB has responsibility to provide safety and security support for:
 - Staff, dependents and other stakeholders
 - Property and assets
- In the field, ADB has responsibility to provide safety and security support for:
 - Staff, dependents and staff consultants
 - Property and assets

Our Responsibilities

- Duty of care responsibility for other stakeholders
- Duty of care responsibility for staff, dependents and others outside of official functional duties

Crisis Management System

- Allowing for effective emergency response by providing an established structure
- Assisting decision makers with best possible advice
- Recognizing the uniqueness of each situation

Business Continuity

- Ensure that critical service and processes can continue
- Ensure restoration of facilities and equipment in a timely fashion
- Ensure timely business resumption for essential business functions

UN Security Management Network



- Memorandum of Understanding signed in April 2002
- Enabling effective and efficient conduct of activities
- Ensuring security, safety and well being

Coordination of Security Arrangements

- All international staff (except Philippines)
- Baseline for minimum security standards at field offices
- ADB will exceed the minimum standards where necessary

UN MoU Key Features

- Security Management Team (SMT)
- Minimum Operating Security Standards (MOSS/MORSS)
- UN Field Security Officer
- Basic and Advanced Field Security Training
- UNDSS Website/Travel Security clearances - ISECT
